"Courmayeur Aid station, the second aid station runners receive crewing, so it is awesome to see how they work with their crew and quickly they go in and out of this aid station and they are moving in the early hours of the morning, some crazy stats exist from this location, like the past 5 winners have all arrived here in first place, even though it is only 83.5km into the race (need to fact check this). But a great moment to see in the race. This year they will also have directional microphones to capture the conversation between crew and runner. This is also a very common place for runners to drop."

"Arnovaz - this will be live from 4am local time until 7am... Hosted by myself and Alexis... we should have a bit of fun here whilst the rest of Europe sleeps, we will hold the fort and livestream."

1:00 PM - Grand Col Ferret 🌄

"The Grand Col Ferret in an amazing drone shot of this high pass with sunrise, watching the leaders move over this section is spectacular. This is their transition from Italy to Switzerland."

3:30 PM - Champex-Lac (1st Male) 🌞

"Champex-Lac, the first time the runners see crew in the day light, pivotal moment in the race as this marks the 'homestretch!'"

4:45 PM - Champex-Lac (1st Female) 🌞

"Champex-Lac, the first time the runners see crew in the day light, pivotal moment in the race as this marks the 'homestretch!'"

5:00 PM - Col de la Forclaz (1st Male) 🎉
